The Entrepreneur Hub (E-Hub) program provides entrepreneurial development and cultural community change through discovery, empowerment, mentoring, networking and community partnerships. E-Hub, a community entrepreneur program of the Urban Hope Entrepreneur center and a 501(c)3 corporation, was founded by Reggie and Sara White and several Green Bay community leaders.

The E-Hub program, to be launched in Rock County in early 2010, is a proven, successful model that has resulted in over 500 business start-ups and reboots, and thousands of part-time and full-time jobs since 1998. The model has also been launched in several cities in the Canton, Ohio area since 2006.

E-Hub, which is founded on the core concept of giving back, provides:

- Evaluation of the business concept and an entrepreneurial asset analysis
- Training that includes six half-day classes for entrepreneurs and business owners covering business ethics, leadership, and managerial operational skills
- Support through a comprehensive network of business professionals and mentors
- Peer-to-peer relationships that foster cooperation and match strengths among participants
- Partnerships that maximize the opportunity for entrepreneurial success

The E-Hub model is effective in large part, because local leaders, like you, actively build a community with optimal conditions to support entrepreneurial activity for small business success.
