


## STEPS FOR DOWNLOADING AND INSTALLING A JAVA APPLET

The Power Profiler requires a Java Applet to be installed on your PC.

An applet is a program written in the Java™ programming language that can be included in an HTML page, much in the same way an image is included. When you use a Java technology-enabled browser to view a page that contains an applet, the applet's code is transferred to your system and executed by the browser's Java Virtual Machine (JVM).


There are many applications that use this Java Applet, so you may already have it installed.

If you do not have the Java Applet installed, you will see the following message upon attempting to sign into the Power Profiler.



## Steps to installing the Java Applet

- 1) If your Internet Explorer is configured to disallow Pop-Ups, you will want to remove this configuration so that **Pop-Ups are allowed** during the Java Applet installation. See above diagram with arrow pointing to the button allowing you access to this. (You may disallow Pop-Ups again when the installation is complete.)



- 2) After removing the Pop-Up blocker, you may get a dialog message box asking you to **retry**. Press the **Yes** button if you get this message.
- 3) You may then need to download the Windows Installer Package that will allow the Java Applet to be downloaded to you PC. If you do not already have the Windows Installer Package on your PC, you will receive the following message.



- 4) You can access this by double-clicking on the same area where the Pop-Up Blocker button is located as shown in Step 1. You will see the following dialog box. Press the **Yes** button. (see example below)



- 5) The Java Applet will begin downloading. This process may take one minute or it may take twenty minutes depending on how fast your internet connection is. Throughout this process, you will see the following screen with a message in the lower left hand corner stating "Loading Java Applet". (see example below)
