The total project cost is \$14.9 million. The "Growing our Parks: Recreation for Generations" campaign has a goal of raising \$1.7 million toward that cost through

generous giving from individuals, businesses, and foundations. So far \$1.1 million has been committed. The completion of the total project is Spring 2024.

Larry recalls, "To be perfectly honest, both Marsha and I had mixed feelings about what should be done regarding the replacement of the old pool. The citizens of Evansville helped us make our decision. Once a good plan was in place, we knew we were going to do our part to support the project. We feel strongly the whole addition to Evansville is 'for the kids' and therefore we made our commitment to donate to the campaign to help raise the \$1.7 million needed. We are asking our friends and all members of the community to consider making a donation to help us reach our goal. Remember, 'it's for the kids!'
